From Sharm El Sheikh begins this enthralling journey to the wonderful ancient city of Petra, one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. Ferrying across the Gulf of Aqaba into Jordan, you shall be greeted by your guide for the unforgettable experience of exploring Petra, or Rose City, named after the picturesque pink sandstone cliffs that surround it.

Enter through the Siq, a narrow passage between high rock walls leading to the magnificent Al-Khazneh, or Treasury, the most photographed monument in Petra. Interview the Royal Tombs, Facade Street, the Great Temple, and the ancient amphitheater, each testifying to this once-glorious Nabataean civilization. Let your expert guide share the fascinating history of Petra from its days as a great trading hub right into the 19th century when it was rediscovered.

Once the wonders of Petra have been explored, enjoy a Jordanian lunch before making your way back to Aqaba and return to Sharm El Sheikh. The wonder of this full-day trip is its opportunity to take you back to gaze in admiration upon the glorious beauty and mysteries of Petra, an absolute must on the itinerary of serious historians and travelers in search of a memorable trip that is cultural.

Itinerary

Sharm to Petra Day Tour

Transfer from your hotel in early morning Sharm El Sheikh to the marina, where you board a ferry to Aqaba, the more vibrant coastal city in Jordan. Meet your guide on arrival, then get ready to enjoy an exciting scenic drive across breathtaking landscapes in the Jordanian desert, making your way to the famous Petra. Admire the mountains and valleys as you fly through this ancient land set on an adventure of a lifetime.

Enter Petra through the famous Siq, a narrow canyon flanked by imposing cliffs. Cross this canyon toward the amazing Treasury (Al-Khazneh), the main monument of Petra. Gasp at the intricately carved façade, attesting to the skill and artistry of the Nabataeans. Continue your guided walk through the ancient city, wandering through the Royal Tombs, the Roman-style Amphitheater, and the Street of Facades. Join the fascinating history of Petra as a thriving trade hub that became hidden for centuries before being rediscovered in the 19th century.

You may have an exquisite Jordanian lunch in a local restaurant after your Petra tour and commence your journey back. There is a little stop in Aqaba for a while to let you walk along the Red Sea or shop for rare souvenirs before returning aboard the ferry to Sharm El Sheikh. Transfer back to the hotel after arrival for free time to contemplate an extraordinary day spent unearthing probably one of the most incredible archaeological wonders on earth. One-day tours are perfect for capturing a glimpse of the magic of Petra, and this will be an unmissable experience for both historical and adventure enthusiasts.
