Have fun in Alexandria, where you can picture many important events that occurred in the city while visiting its important sites. Grab the opportunity to enjoy what the city has to offer in terms of tourism while also enjoying its moderately hot climate. Summers are from May to October, and the temperatures are 30 degrees Celsius to 32 degrees Celsius. The city experiences a mild and humid winter, which starts in November and lasts until April. Throughout the day, the temperature is around 20 degrees Celsius and drops to about 10 degrees during the night. During this season, light rain is common.

Alexandria contains various Pharaonic monuments. It is said that when the Greeks arrived to the city, they managed to find 28 statues of the Sphinx, 3 statues of Ptolemy as well as one of the Egyptian Queen Isis, all of which were made in a Pharaonic style along with some obelisks that the Ptolemies plundered and smuggled to the western countries. It is suspected that many of the statues were sculpted due to the Greeks and Egyptians fascination with Pharaohs obelisks. Alexandria is also widely known for numerous archaeological sites and Pharaonic monuments. There are also tombs, temples, and theaters built in the ancient era. Come see for yourselves and we hope you shall exceed your expectations.

Tour in Alexandria

Our guide will meet you first thing in the morning at the hotel and then take you to many interesting sights. You will visit the last remaining ruins of the Serapeum, the temple of the Ptolemaic god Serapis, which was founded by King Ptolemy III during the third century BC. The temple was the largest and most important temple in Alexandria in the Greek and Roman eras (Pompey's Pillar).

After that, you will visit Kom El-Shafafah and the guide will provide you with information about it, such as the layout of the cemetery, the branching of the tombs and their sequence, and the difference in the decorative elements in it, which makes us believe that this cemetery was not built all at once. Excavations have confirmed that the cemetery was expanded during the following centuries, but the similarity of the architectural and decorative elements makes us not extend the period during which the cemetery was expanded to a long time ago. The cemetery, or rather the oldest part of it (i.e. the main cemetery), dates back to the period between the first and second centuries AD.

After a delicious lunch and seafood experience in Alexandria, you will be transferred to the Bibliotheca Alexandrina and then Qaitbay Fortress. In the Citadel, you will be able to do many activities such as entering the Maritime Museum in Qaitbay Citadel (Aquarium Museum) and discovering the exhibits of famous and rare fish, marine animals, plants and algae. Take photos of the stone walkway next to the Citadel.
