Itinerary

Day 1 - Fly to Cairo / Cairo Highlights

In the morning, one of our Cairo top tours tour guides will pick you up from wherever you want to be in Aswan and transport you to the Aswan Airport in time to catch your flight to Cairo, where your personal professional tour guide will be waiting to meet you. The Giza Pyramids are one of the Seven Wonders of the

Ancient World, and the building of these three crown jewels took place during the 4th dynasty's reign.

Next, we'll move on to [The Magnificent Sphinx](#), which is the iconic symbol of [the Giza Pyramids](#) Complex and was commissioned by King Chephren in the fourth dynasty. The Great Sphinx was built with a pharaoh's head and a lion's body to be more fearsome for foes since it was thought to be the truly more sturdy of the Giza Pyramids and other colossal elements at the Complex.

after that, we will transfer to have lunch in an amazing restaurant in the area then Check-in 5* hotel to spend the night.

Day 2 - Travel to Alexandria / Back to Aswan

After breakfast at the hotel, your expert Egyptologist will drive you to the must-see sites in Alexandria in a private air-conditioned vehicle.

The Pompey's Pillar is a Roman triumphal column that was built in Alexandria to celebrate Augustus Diocletian. First, we'll go there. It is around 28 meters tall, is built of red granite, and is the biggest memorial column in Egypt. next we will transfer to One of the Seven Wonders of the Middle Ages is thought to be the Catacombs. It was built in the second century AD, and a donkey accidentally discovered it around 1900. Its remarkable construction, which blends Roman and Pharaonic styles, makes it a must-see destination. after that, we will visit [the Citadel of Qaitbey](#) which constructed the Islamic defensive castle known in the year 1477. It is one of the strongest defenses on the Mediterranean Sea Coast and is situated in Alexandria city, close to where the historic Alexandria Lighthouse formerly stood. then we will have lunch at a local restaurant and continue the trip to Alexandria Library which consider the most well-famed cultural spot in the Middle East and it's the truly wealthy home of the most unique books of all fields in Arabic, English, and French.

finally, we will transfer you to [Cairo airport](#) to fly back to Aswan and drive you to your hotel or any place you decide in Aswan.
