The first place, <u>Luxor Temple</u> not like most of the other temples in ancient Egyptian, is not located in an east-west axis but is directed towards <u>Karnak Temple</u>. That was the result of being the main venue for one of the most important of ancient Egyptian religious celebrations, when the cult images of Amun, his wife Mut, and their son, the lunar god Khonsu, were taken from their temples in Karnak and transferred in a grand procession to their so they could be able to connect with the god that resides there, Amenemopet. This was the Opet Festival's reason and meaning.

The Second place will be Haward Carter House, the house of the great scientist. On November 4, 1922, Carter found the first sign of what proved to be <u>Tutankhamun's tomb</u>, but it was not until November 26 that a second sealed doorway was reached, behind which was the treasure.

then you will visit the Valley of the kings The last royal buried there was the mommy of Ramesses XI, but there are some other proofs and opinions think that nobles continue to steal tombs around the area for a while after the last pharaonic burial. But they believed that the valley contains 63 tombs.

and we will continue our journey to explore the Ramesseum It was called a "million years temple" because of its huge surface area.

finally will visit the Colossi of Memnon The two great and huge statues of Amenhotep III were originally built as a gate to the large mortuary complex of Amenhotep III. Some natural factors including, floods, earthquakes, and other events made some features disappear from it, in addition, Ancient Egyptians used some of the monuments of the complex to build other attractions.
