Day 1: Arrival in Cairo

Our tour guide will meet you and assist you at [Cairo International Airport](#) when you arrive. There is no charge for evening accommodations, and depending on your arrival, you may choose to spend the night at the hotel. You will be driven to your hotel in a private, air-conditioned automobile.

Day 2: Giza Pyramids, Sphinx, and the Egyptian Museum

Your [Cairo day tour](#) will start when our tour guide picks you up from your hotel after breakfast. The Cheops, Chephren, and Mykerinus Pyramids will be your first stops. The Tour will also stop at [the Valley Temple](#), which is a portion of the Pyramids of Chephren, before arriving at the Great Sphinx.

To examine some of the most priceless works of art from the Paranoic era, we'll go to [the Egyptian Museum](#). Along with treasures on display from the museum's magnificent 5000-year-old collection, items that have been preserved in [Tutankhamen](#)'s tomb for more than 3,500 years are also on view.

Day 3: Memphis and Sakkara Tour

Our tour guide will pick you up from your hotel after breakfast, and our first destination will be [Sakkara](#), an incredibly significant archaeological site in Egypt. Sakkara served as the necropolis for [Memphis](#), the ancient capital of Egypt, and it held the tombs of pharaohs, their families, and their courtiers. The site is vast, offering numerous fascinating attractions.

Our tour will commence with [the Step Pyramid](#) of Zoser, the oldest pyramid in Egypt. Constructed in the 27th century BC, this architectural wonder showcases remarkable engineering skills.

Next on our [Egypt tour Packages from](#) the USA itinerary is the Pyramid of Teti, which was built for Pharaoh Teti of the Sixth Dynasty. Though smaller in scale compared to the Step Pyramid, it remains an impressive structure. Additionally, we will explore the renowned tomb of Queen Nefertari, an exquisite burial site situated in the Valley of the Queens.

Following these visits, we will proceed to [the Red Pyramid](#), the largest among the three major pyramids at Sakkara. Its awe-inspiring red limestone construction is a sight to behold. Finally, we will conclude our tour by visiting the Pyramids of Unas and Userkaf, the final major pyramids at Sakkara. These sites provide just a glimpse of the rich offerings Sakkara presents. There are countless more tombs and pyramids awaiting exploration, and we hope you will return to experience them all!

Day 4: Old Cairo Tour

The [Salah El Din Citadel](#), which Salah El Din built in 1183 AD to defend Cairo from the Crusader army on the Moqattam hills, will be the first destination you go to. Our tour guide will pick you up from your hotel after breakfast to begin our [Egypt-day tour](#). After that, go to the Mohamed Ali Alabaster Mosque, which was built for Egypt's last monarch, Mohamed Ali.

Then, we'll ride across the city in a horse-drawn carriage. This is a fantastic opportunity to experience the city's sights and sounds and get a sense of Cairo's pace of life. We'll go on a walking tour after that. This is an

excellent way to take your time and thoroughly enjoy your exploration of the city.

Day 5: Cairo by Night

After breakfast, we will have a tranquil felucca trip down [the River Nile](#) as part of the [Egypt Nile Cruise](#), where you may see the lovely view of Cairo at night, the warm sun, or the sunset, as you'd like. Following that, you can start a shopping Tour in Cairo.

Continuing our tour, we will explore the [Catacombs of Kom el-Shoqafa](#), ancient catacombs that date back to the 2nd century AD. These catacombs are a must-visit for history enthusiasts, providing a captivating glimpse into the past.

Lastly, we will conclude our tour with a visit to [Pompey's Pillar](#), an iconic Roman column that stands as one of the tallest in Egypt. This architectural marvel serves as a symbol of Alexandria's rich Roman heritage.

Day 7: Fly to Luxor

Following breakfast, our tour guide will pick you up from your accommodation and take you to the Cairo airport to start your new trip. We will take a plane to the ancient city of Luxor, where King Tutankhamun is interred in a spectacular tomb. Our tour guide will welcome you when we arrive in [Luxor](#) City and take you to your hotel, the Steigenberger Nile Palace or similar, where you can rest up for your first night in Luxor.

Day 8: Luxor hot air balloon ride

The best way to make your time in Luxor memorable is to take a hot air [balloon ride in Luxor](#) after breakfast. Gently moving through the Nobles Mountain, Queen's Valley, and [Valley of the Kings](#) In 30:45 minutes, depending on the weather, the flight lasts.

Day 9: Embarkation - Luxor East Bank Tours

Our tour guide will take you to your boat (Obelisk Aswan or comparable; Royal Adventure or comparable) in a private, air-conditioned car. The excursion starts with a visit to the [Karnak temple](#), which once stood as one of the biggest religious buildings in the world, followed by lunch on board. In particular, Ramses II's sculptures and monuments are some of the most stunning in all of Egypt.

Our next stop after leaving Karnak will be the [Luxor Temple](#) Here, you may see King Tutankhamun's tomb and the Colossi of Amenhotep III, two of Egypt's most renowned artifacts. You will then be transported to your Nile cruise, where you can rest and eat.

Day 10: Luxor West Bank Tours

a wonderful breakfast. Our next stop will be the Tombs of The [Valley of The Kings](#) at Luxor, one of Egypt's most magnificent ancient tombs. We're going to the Deir El Bahari temple on our next trip. We'll stop at the [Colossi of Memnon](#) on the route back to the ferry. After that, we'll see you again when you cruise the Nile.

Day 11: Kom Ombo Temple

right following breakfast. We will take you up from the Nile cruise to the [Kom Ombo Temple](#), which is located 40 kilometers north of [Aswan](#) at a local village site. The majority of its construction took place during the Ptolemaic and Roman eras, and it was dedicated to the gods Sobek and Horus (332 B.C. to 395 A.C.).

You will then be taken back to your Nile cruise ship, where you can unwind. You will take in an evening performance of Egyptian folklore.

Day 12: Aswan Tour

We will see [the High Dam](#) after breakfast before proceeding on to the [unfinished obelisk](#) We'll take a miniature speedboat to get to the [Philae Temple](#), our final destination for the day. Return to your cruise ship later for dinner, a folkloric performance, and the overnight.

Day 13: Abu Simbel Temples

After breakfast, we will travel to the [Abu Simbel Temples](#), which were carved out of the mountain on the west bank of the Nile between 1274 and 1244 B.C. and were dedicated to Ramses the Second, Ra-Harakhty, Amun Ra, and Ptah and featured four colossal statues. The Second Temple was dedicated to Queen Nefertari and the Goddess Hathor. The two temples were taken apart piece by piece and reassembled higher up. The preservation of the two temples at Abu Simbel must be the greatest achievement of Unesco. After that, we take you back to the cruise ship so you can spend the night there and unwind.

Day 14: Aswan to Marsa Allam

Early in the morning, our tour guide will pick you up from [Marsa Allam](#) in an air-conditioned car or on a plane. When we arrive at your hotel, the Hilton Nubia or a comparable facility, our tour guide will welcome you and help you check in so you can unwind before the evening drive to Marsa Allam.

Day 15: Free Day at Marsa Allam

Our tour guide will be ready to greet you as we begin our Trip across the city. We'll visit the mosque and the bazaar as well. We will also learn about the city's history and antiquity. Before we take you back to your hotel, eat lunch at a local restaurant after that.
