Day 1: Arrival in Cairo

An English-speaking representative will meet you at [Cairo International Airport](#), help with any processes, and drive you to the Cairo Pyramids hotel where you may spend the night.

Day 2: Memphis Pyramid

On the second day you will take your breakfast, and we will transport you to your first location after meeting you in the hotel lobby in the morning. [Memphis'](#) Pyramid. At first, the Pyramid was 52 meters tall with a base that was around 78 meters wide. But over time, a large portion of the pyramid was lost or eroded, leaving it just around 15 meters high today.

Large, precisely-cut stone blocks were not used in the construction of the Memphis Pyramid, in contrast to the other main [Egyptian pyramids](#). Rather, mud bricks coated with limestone were used in its construction. The pyramid has not endured as long as its counterparts at Giza and other places of Egypt, in part because of this.

Day 3: The National Museum of Egyptian Civilization (NMEC)

Following breakfast, you will be met at your Cairo hotel by our knowledgeable tour guide, who will then take you on an amazing visit to (NMEC),

The [National Museum of Egypt \(NMEC\)](#) is a museum that houses a vast collection of artifacts dating back to prehistoric times. Its main attraction is the Royal Mummies Hall, which displays the mummies of pharaohs and queens from the New Kingdom era, such as [Ramesses II](#) and Hatshepsut. The NMEC also offers interactive exhibits, multimedia displays, and educational programs to educate visitors about Egyptian history and culture. It also features modern amenities like a gift shop, restaurant, and conference center.

From Cairo, visitors can transfer to Ismailia, located on the west bank of the Suez Canal. Ismailia is home to the [Suez Canal](#) University and other cultural and historical landmarks. The Suez Canal is an artificial sea-level waterway that connects the Mediterranean Sea to the [Red Sea](#), allowing ships to travel between Europe and Asia without traveling around Africa's southern tip.

Day 4: Alexandria tour

On the third day, following breakfast at the hotel, we will transport you to Alexandria, a city brimming with endless historical sites. You're going to visit Alex.

The [Kom Ash Shogafa](#), an ancient necropolis, is a must-see attraction in Alexandria, featuring Roman, Greek, and Egyptian architectural styles. [Pompey's Pillar](#), a towering column, offers a panoramic view of the city and is a must-see attraction. The [Bibliotheca Alexandria](#), a modern library, is a tribute to the ancient Library of Alexandria, showcasing its vast collection of books and exhibits.

The [Qaitbay](#) fortress, built in the 15th century, is a historic fortress with impressive architecture and history as a strategic stronghold. Sidi Morsi Abu al-Abbas Mosque, located in the heart of Alexandria's old city, offers intricate architecture, local religious customs, and Islam's role in Egyptian culture.

Visitors can enjoy Egyptian cuisine, stroll along beaches, and waterfront promenades before returning to the Hotel.

Day 5: El-Alamein tour

After your breakfast, let's situated around 106 kilometers west of Alexandria, in the [Matrouh Governorate](#) of Egypt, is the beach city of El Alamein. The city is well-known for its historical significance as the location of the Battle of El Alamein, two significant World War II engagements that took place in 1942 and 1943.

El Alamein is a well-liked travel destination, drawing travelers who come to take in the breathtaking scenery and ancient buildings. The [German War Cemetery](#) is the last resting place for almost 4,000 German troops who died during the fight. The city is also home to various museums, including as the El Alamein War Museum (Optional activity), which features relics and memorabilia from the conflicts.

Beautiful beaches may also be found in El Alamein, such as Marassi Beach, which is renowned for its crystal-clear seas and breathtaking sunsets, and Cleopatra Beach, which is rumored to have been visited by the ancient Egyptian queen herself.
