Ensuite, nous nous dirigerons vers les dunes de sable blanc du Sahara occidental. Vous pourrez y faire du sand boarding, monter à dos de chameau et observer les étoiles. Vous visiterez également la magnifique oasis de Bahariya et vous vous renseignerez sur les circuits en Égypte au départ du Caire pour en savoir plus sur ces lieux.

Day 1: Arrival and Overnight in Cairo

When you arrive at the Cairo airport, a representative from our company will help you with the passport control procedures and will welcome you. You will be driven to your swiss inn hotel in a private A/C car from the airport. Overnight in Cairo.

Day 2: Giza Tours and Overnight in Cairo

Breakfast. Visit the Valley Temple after spending the first part of your day touring [the Great Pyramids](#) of Cheops, Chephren, and Mykerinos. The location where King Chephren, owner of the second pyramid at Giza, had his dead corpse mummified. Additionally, it is the same location where you can get a close-up view of [the Sphinx](#), a mythological protector with a lion's body and a head of king Chephren that guards a vast burial complex.

Between visits, lunch is provided at a nearby restaurant based on a full meal for each person; however, beverages are not covered.

then we will visit the [Egyptian Antiquities Museum](#). The largest and most priceless examples of Egyptian art are on exhibit there. It displays a unique collection of over 250,000 authentic artefacts that go back as far as 5000 years, including a special exhibition devoted to the Tutankhamun - A collection of treasures, gold, and jewellery that were buried in his tomb for more than 3,500 years before they were found in the 1920s when his tomb was excavated. Day 3 - Cairo to the white desert

Your tour guide will pick you up from your accommodation in Cairo and transport you 350 kilometers east to [the Bahariya Oasis](#). After finishing this excursion, which takes about 4 hours, you'll get in your 4x4 Jeep and head to the black desert. In this oasis near El Haize, lunch will be served.

Afterward, we'll take a trip to [the Agabat Valley](#). When we get to the Valley of Agabat, which is located deep inside of Egypt's white desert, truly experience the place's otherworldly splendor, you must be there. The location was formerly submerged in water millions of years ago.

Over time, distinctive limestone, chalk, and even sand rock formations emerged. The most well-known desert site in Egypt will be our focus as we tour the White Desert National Park. The rock formations dissolve as the sky turns pink, then the darkest flaming orange, and there is quiet everywhere. You will feel as though nothing has ever tasted so wonderful as you eat chicken, rice, and veggies while seated around a tiny fire. The supper and desert camping will be handled by the Bedouin crew.

Day4- Bahariya oasis-Cairo

At 06:00 am Enjoy the dawn. You'll eat breakfast in the desert at 7:00 AM before traveling to Bahariya Oasis.

Additionally, on the way back, you'll make a stop at [Crystal Mountain](#), commonly known locally as Gebel al-Izzaz. The term "the Jewel of the Desert" and the hill's spectacular look when lighted by the sun are attributed to the quartzite crystals that make up the hill, which can be seen on the right. That innate characteristic was stumbled upon a few decades ago.

Next, we'll travel to the Bahariya Oasis to unwind in the hot spring known as Bir Sigam. The spring, which is located on Cairo Road 7 km east of Bahariya, is the best hot spring in terms of temperature.

Day 5 - Day Tour to El Fayoum

Your hotel in Cairo will be picked up by our representative so you may see El Fayoum's major locations. [Fayoum](#) is roughly 95 kilometers from Cairo. In 1989, Wadi El Ryan was declared a protected area, where all visits are now made. About 90 kilometers from Fayoum, where we will begin our excursion, is the [Wadi Hitan](#) Protected Area (Valley of the Whales). Due to the 40 million-year-old whale skeletons discovered there, Wadi Hitan, also known as the Valley of the Whales, was recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site and is situated inside the Wadi El Rayan Protected Area.

See Mudawara Mountain on the route to Wadi El Rayan Water Falls. then into the waterfalls of Wadi Al Ryan. The only waterfalls in Egypt may be found at Wadi El Rayan, a natural depression in the western desert that was created in 1970 by the overflow of drainage water from the Fayoum farmlands. Wadi El Rayan is made up of two lakes united by a cascade. At a high caliber restaurant, late lunch will be provided. Transfer back to Cairo after that.
