Day 1: Arrival at Cairo

A representative from our firm will meet you at [Cairo International Airport](#). They will transport you to your Cairo hotel in an air-conditioned vehicle, assist you with check-in, and then go so you can prepare for the next day.

Day 2: Egyptian Museum & Great Pyramids

Our tour guide will pick you up from your hotel after breakfast and transport you to the [Giza Necropolis](#). There are views of the Great Sphinx, the [King Khufu Valley Temple](#), and the Great Three Pyramids of Giza.

After that, you'll have lunch before touring the [Egyptian Museum](#) is the Middle East's oldest archeological museum, housing the world's best treasures from the Predynastic to the Greco-Roman periods.

When the day is done, we'll drive you back to your hotel.

Day 3: Coptic Cairo & Khan El Khalil

After breakfast, your tour guide will meet you there and bring you to [Old Cairo](#), where you may see the Coptic sector of the Egyptian capital.

The Ben Ezra Synagogue, the [Hanging Church](#) (designed like Noah's ark), and the Church of Abu Serga will be the first sites on the day trip in Old Cairo. All of these locations are supposed to have been used by Jesus as hiding places.

You will have the opportunity to visit the [Khan el-Khalili](#) market and enjoy some traditional tea at the Al Fishawy Café before returning to your lodging.

Day 4: Transfer to Aswan

On the fourth day, you will be transferred to Aswan.

After breakfast the next morning, check out of your Cairo hotel and drive yourself to the airport to catch your flight to Aswan.

Prepare you to explore the [High Dam](#) was begun in 1960 and finished in 1971, generating a massive reservoir called Lake Nasser, which contained over 137 cubic meters of water and was named after former Egyptian President Nasser. It was filled in 1979.

After Lunch you will discover the [Philae Temple](#), It was renamed Agilkia after being called after its southern position in Egypt. And the [Unfinished Obelisk](#) with your tour guide, who will teach you everything you need to know about the history of each area.

At the end of the day, make your way back to your ship for dinner.

The meals are breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 5: Luxor East Bank

After breakfast, your day trip to Luxor on the East Bank will begin when you meet with our tour guide and are brought to the Ramses II granite sculptures at the [Karnak temple](#). The Luxor Temple unlike the other temples in Luxor, which were erected for the worship of one of ancient Egypt's gods, the [Luxor Temple](#) was not created for one god or a deity version of the king himself after his death. will be your next stop after lunch.

Take a shuttle back to your cruise ship at the conclusion of the day.

Day 6: Luxor West Bank

Check out of your Nile Cruise in the morning before being taken by our guide to the Colossi of Memnon and the temple of [El Deir El Bahri](#) (Queen Hatshepsut's Mortuary Temple).

Have lunch at a local restaurant before seeing the Valley of the Kings, the [Temple of Medinet Habu](#), and Deir El Madina, the worker's village where all the artisans and craftsmen who helped beautify the tombs at the [Valley of the Kings](#) formerly resided until their deaths. This was done to keep tomb robbers from discovering the site of the necropolis.

At the end of the day, you will be transported to the airport to catch your domestic flight to Cairo.

Day 7: Alexandria Tour

You will travel from Cairo to Alexandria in a private air-conditioned automobile with our guide.

The Sultan Qutbay Palace, the [Pompey Pillar](#) was called after Pompey, a Roman statesman and commander, however it is not related with him. That is because it was stated that Pompey deserted his homeland and fled the troops during a critical period of war to fly the coop to his village, after which he was slain and his head was left atop the pillar. The biggest Roman cemetery, and the [Catacombs of Kom El Shokafa](#), three levels of tunnels cut into the underground rock. They show how Roman and Egyptian art may coexist.

After that, go to the [Alexandria Biblioteca](#) before returning to your Alexandria hotel.

Breakfast and lunch are served.

Day 8: Alexandria & Siwa

When you depart your Alexandria hotel, your expert guide will transport you to the [Siwa Oasis](#) in a private A/C car.

Your full-day journey will begin in the ancient city of Siwa and will include stops at the [Alexander Temple](#) and the Amun Ra Temple. The Tombs on the Mountain of the Dead, the Siwa Museum, and the Crocodile Tombs are among the other attractions.

Pay a visit to Siwa and spend the night there.

Breakfast and lunch are provided.

Day 9: Back to Cairo
