Private Alexandria: Kom el Shoqafa, Pompey Pillar, Library, Qaitbay castle & the Roman Theater Tour

Start your private tour at the Kom el Shoqafa catacombs, a historical marvel that reveals Alexandria's ancient splendor. These tombs, carved into the bedrock, showcase an extraordinary fusion of Egyptian, Greek, and Roman influences.

From the depths of the catacombs, you'll ascend to the impressive Pompey's Pillar, one of Alexandria's most enduring landmarks. This colossal granite column, standing tall amidst the remnants of the ancient Serapeum, is a relic of Roman architectural brilliance.

The tour culminates with visits to two of Alexandria's most significant sites: the Qaitbay Citadel and the Roman Theater. The Qaitbay Citadel, a 15th-century fortress built on the ruins of the ancient Pharos Lighthouse, stands as a sentinel over the Mediterranean.
